Course Information

Psychology 2 continues the study of the "inner man" with an emphasis on college preparation. This course will help you understand yourself and others better as well as encourage a healthy mental and physical lifestyle. Emphasis will also be placed on gaining a college-like experience and forming good study skills that will set you on the path for success!

WHAT IS A HYBRID CLASS AND IS IT FOR ME?

Since this is the first hybrid course offered here at CSHS, you naturally don't know what it is and what is expected of you. Here is a easy way to look at what it is as well as what it is not. Please read this section carefully as it outlines your expectations for the course.

The hybrid format is not for everyone. Having taken hybrid courses before I can tell you that sometimes hybrid courses can demand more time, dedication, time management skills and more self-directed learning than the traditional face-to-face classroom learning.

Here are some considerations for you that will help you understand the expectations of this course:

Do you express yourself well in writing and have good reading skills?

- Reading and writing are more important than in a traditional face-to-face course.
- You must be able to read others' writing including, but not limited to, your instructor's, your peers, and academic informational texts
- You also have to be able to write clearly and concisely, with few grammatical and/or spelling errors
- You must be able to follow written directions to complete an assignment, and willing to ask questions when you don't understand what to do
- You must be an active and engaged learner who is ready and willing to participate

Are you comfortable working with computers and using the Internet?

Being willing and able to work online and to use computers in your work is critical. If you do not have access at home, it is expected that you figure out a place and time to devote to working online.

- You should own or have access to a reliable computer with fast Internet connection
- You should be able to type well and be able to use basic programs such as a word processor

Are you good at managing and scheduling your time?

You will do at least as much work in a hybrid course as in a regular traditional face-to-face course.

- You should be able to manage your time well and plan for the week ahead
- You should have ~3 hours to devote to the virtual/technology portion of the course outside of school hours
- You should be self-directed and good with deadlines and be able to hold yourself accountable

Are you willing to take responsibility for your own learning as well as work collaboratively with your classmates and instructor?

This hybrid course places significantly less emphasis on lecturing and exams and more on collaborative learning and project based learning

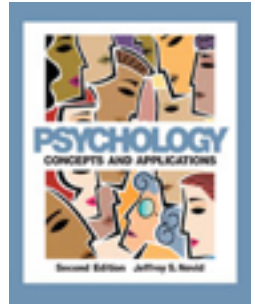
- You should be prepared to do different kinds of work than you would in a traditional face-to-face course
- You will be required to take more responsibility for your learning (help yourselves)
- You will be expected to be involved in small groups/teams as teamwork and feedback is essential

Here is what you can expect for class time and virtual time. Keep in mind this is extremely general:

CLASS TIME	VIRTUAL TIME
Teach and learn concepts/theories/principles/etc.	Explore concepts/theories/principles/etc.
Class discussions whether large group or smaller groups	Class discussions in forums, Google Drive, or Google Hangout
Show understanding of the foundation	Demonstrate/Prove understanding through projects and other high order thinking

OUTLINE OF THE TRIMESTER

Hybrid students are expected to cover the same material as the face-to-face students. Students will be expected to know and understand the readings from the textbook, but the focus will be on the projects and assignments that are intended to prove your level of understanding. Rather than have multiple choice and essay unit tests, a midterm and a final exam, hybrid students will have projects/assignments, an electronic portfolio and journal, and a final culminating project.



This course will cover a variety of topics in psychology including its history, research methods, and biological and cognitive foundations.

ATTENDANCE

Attendance for school hours will be according to school handbook.

Tardies: The school handbook outlines that students will receive a warning on his or her first offense and then will receive a detention for each additional tardy. Students will be marked 'tardy' if he or she is not in his or her seat by the time the bell rings.

Absences: If a student exceeds 6 absences (excused or unexcused) in a trimester, he/she is in violation of the school's attendance policy. Only school related absences like field trips and suspensions do not count towards that number. For example, if your family goes on vacation during school and you miss five school days, all five of those days count. If you get 5 days of OSS, that, however, does not count.

****Hybrid****

The class follows the rough schedule as outlined above. You will have daily assignments and a project for each unit. The project is something you need to consistently work on throughout the unit and is due on the day the unit closes. Half of the time will be used for traditional face-to-face time and the other time will be given to you for lab time. Feel free to bring your own laptops and other devices. Plan on always bringing your earbuds/headphones.

CLASS POLICIES

All assignments are turned in virtually on the shared google docs form. Upload all assignments on the chart and when completed fill in the square with the appropriate project/assignment (file or link). Most of the assignments will be asked to be completed on your electronic portfolio/blog/website.

Late work - While I never accept late work in a traditional face-to-face course, my policy for the hybrid course is different. Students have until the end of the unit to turn everything in. After that, it will be on a case by case scenario.

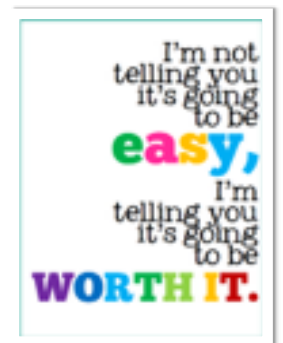
